- With approval of the Meeting, we wrote a letter to the Yearly Meeting in which we express our support of the lawsuit aimed at blocking ICE activities during worship.
- We are following the work of FCNL who stands against the deportation of migrants.

- We will remind new legislators of the significance of the Inflation Reduction Act in supporting significant environmental changes.
